Thistley Hough Academy's Careers Programme embraces the Gatsby Benchmarks into the delivery of the curriculum content and tutor guided programme of study, achieving the Quality Kitemark Award for CEIAG. This programme follows the student's career journey from y7 throughout their time with us at Thistley Hough Academy and their future career pathways. Departmental Career Coordinators support the planning, delivery and implementation of subject specific careers guidance, experiences and guest speakers, while form tutors follow a rolling programme of career and life skill sessions.

These are 8 Gatsby Benchmarks that our careers programme includes:

- 2. Learning from career and labour market information

- 4. Linking curriculum learning to careers

The key objective is to build students aspirations, self-analysis and awareness from the moment students join the Academy, ensuring that they are guided and supported as they move successfully through the school to Year 11 and beyond, with the skills, experiences and knowledge to pursue a positive and appropriate College/Training provider/Apprenticeship course. To support the student's transition into their future pathways, we work closely with 3rd parties, Employers, Colleges and training providers to support the student's individual needs, providing pathway guidance and encounters through assemblies, Parents Evenings, PSHE Ambition Curriculum lessons, Careers Fairs, educational visits and interview scenarios.
